

PUBLIC CONSULTATION

GRAND PARC DE L'EST

The [Commission sur l'eau, l'environnement, le développement durable et les grands parcs](#) is consulting the residents of the agglomeration of Montréal on the Grand Parc de l'Est.

The Grand Parc de l'Est is a large-scale project aimed at protecting, enhancing, and connecting vast natural areas in eastern Montréal. This public consultation will allow the public to share their ideas, concerns, and aspirations to inform the Commission's recommendations on the future of this area.

Does this topic interest you? Take part in a collective effort to envision the Grand Parc de l'Est for current and future generations. Whether you live nearby, spend time in this area, or are interested in the future of Montréal's natural spaces, the Commission wants to hear from you.

Step 1 — Get Informed

The consultation document and key issues will be presented at a **public information session**. There, you can ask questions of the people in charge.

Step 2 — Have Your Say: Various Ways to Get Involved

There are several ways for you to share your opinions, ideas, and concerns regarding the Grand Parc de l'Est.

If you wish to present your views at these sessions, you must register. Time will be set aside for your presentation and for discussion with the commissioners. You can register using the [online form](#) or by phone at 514 872-3000. The registration deadline is October 20 at 5 p.m.

3— **Share your opinion, ideas, or experience online** using the participation tools at realisonsmtl.ca/grand-parc-de-lest (in French).

The opinions gathered throughout this process will help inform the Commission's analysis and the development of its recommendations.

Step 3 — Participate in the meeting to adopt the recommendations

After hearing and reviewing the opinions, the commissioners will meet in working sessions to prepare recommendations.

These recommendations will be adopted at a public meeting. You can attend and ask questions about the recommendations.

The date, time, and location of the meeting will be announced at a later date.

Accessibility

The meeting room is accessible to people with limited mobility. Quebec Sign Language (LSQ) interpretation service is available upon request, submitted five days in advance, and subject to the availability of interpreters. City hall has an accessible restroom.

The entrances on Place Vauquelin (ground level) and Rue Gosford (access ramp) are accessible.
