2023-037 RESOLUTION FOR THE PURPOSE OF ENSURING PUBLIC PARTICIPATION IN DETERMINING THE FUTURE OF ZONES MU1 AND MU2

WHEREAS an Interim Control By-Law has been put into effect as a temporary measure to give Council the time necessary to revise our planning program by-law such that, within the context of the planning objectives of the Montreal Metropolitan Community, it better addresses the concerns of our citizens regarding the environment, densification, and preservation of those elements that contribute to the special character of Pointe-Claire;

WHEREAS the most significant area of our City with respect to its continued economic vitality is the City Centre which further requires its planned future be addressed as a priority;

WHEREAS the imminent arrival of the REM light rail service has enormously impacted the economic potential of the City Centre;

Whereas the project to construct a pedestrian and bicycle overpass crossing highway 40 in the City Centre is in an advanced state of planning;

WHEREAS the Quebec Ministry of the Environment has mandated the protection of the wetland within Zone Mu2;

It is moved by Councillor Brent Cowan, Seconded by Councillor Eric Stork, and majoritarily resolved: THAT this Council desires the City Manager, Mrs. Karina Verdon, meet forthwith with representatives of Cadillac-Fairview in camera for the purpose of working out with them a mutually agreeable path forward that will engage public participation in a structured process having as its objective the creation of a comprehensive plan for Zones Mu1 and Mu2 that will establish:

- A. protections of the wetlands and existing natural habitat mosaic;
- B. development limitations and possibilities that will satisfy the expressed collective vision of the citizens of Pointe-Claire while concurrently addressing the commercial interests of Cadillac-Fairview.

THAT the mandate letter to the City Manager from Council that is to provide guidelines for the desired dialog with officials from Cadillac-Fairview be filed with passage of this resolution and be integral to this resolution and that the City Manager will update Council as the dialog advances.

THAT this resolution and the steps and discussions that will result from it are in furtherance of a settlement of the litigation between the City and Cadillac Fairview.
